tax refund

Potentially thousands of northwest Harris County residents who were denied due process after disputing their property values could receive tax refunds from the Harris County Appraisal District.

The agreement is part of a settlement of the class-action lawsuit filed against the HCAD by taxpayers who said they were not allowed to protest their 1984 tax values. The agreement was approved late last week in state district court.

Those affected by the settlement include all county property owners whose valuations increased or applications for exemption were denied in 1984 by the HCAD without an opportunity to protest before the county Appraisal Review Board.

Other persons who attempted to protest their valuations in 1984 must have also tried to protest their 1985 valuations, which were identical to the 1984 figures, in order to be eligible for refunds. Also, taxpayers who tried to protest after their applications to be tax-exempt in 1984 were denied may also be eligible.

Persons who consider themselves eligible for refunds should submit an affidavit documenting denial of due process to Harriet Hubacker, an attorney representing property owners in the case. The cost to file the affidavit is \$25.

During mailing of 1985 hearing orders later this fall, HCAD will send blank affidavits to property owners who received a 1985 hearing. After the affidavits are processed by Hubacker, provided they are not challenged by the district, the property owner's 1985 hearing value will be applied to 1984.
