BOARD OF DIRECTORS

All Directors were present at the last regular monthly meeting of the Oakwood Glen Board of Directors, Tuesday, March 8, at Oakwood Glen Park.

Barbara Fillion, Deed Restrictions Chairman, reported few new violations on the last drive-through. Pressure washing of the fence on Mill Springs is tentatively scheduled for March 26, depending on availability of machine offered by a resident.

Julie Crider, Activities Chairman, reported that there will be an Easter Egg Hunt for the children of the subdivision on April 2 at Oakwood Glen Park (see related article). A Pool Opening party is scheduled for Saturday, May 7, which is still in the planning stages. \$150 was requested and approved for the Easter activity.

David Gleason, Security Directors, reported one burglary in the subdivision last month, which is under investigation (see Security Report). Thirty hours of overtime were requested and approved for the Constable in April.

Liz McNinch, Pool Use Committee Chairman, reported that there have been a few changes made to the pool rules and pool tags and distribution were discussed. The importance of enforcing the rule that residents must show tags when entering the pool area was stressed. A meeting has been scheduled with the pool management company, Toucan Pools, to discuss other concerns. \$900 was approved for purchase of the pool tags. \$250 was approved for purchase

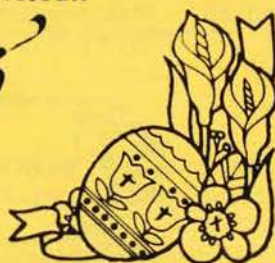
NUN TO SPEAK TO WAF IN APRIL

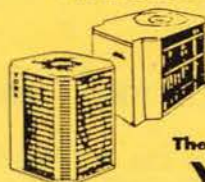


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LIBRARY BOOK SALE RESCHEDULED TO APRIL 15-16

POOL OPENING — POOL TAGS

The Oakwood Glen Pool will open on Saturday, May 1, for this season. A pool opening party is being planned for that day. During May the pool will be open on Saturdays from 10 a.m. till 9 p.m. and on Sundays from 12 noon till 9 p.m.

Pool tags will again be required to use the pool. They will be a different color this year, so all residents need to pick up new tags for their families. These tags will be issued to residents whose maintenance fees have been paid in full. If you are a renter, the owner of the home must have paid his fee in full.

Following is the schedule for distribution of tags at the pool gate, so mark your calendar!

Sat., April 30	10 a.m. - 12 noon
Sun., May 1	12 noon - 2 p.m.
Sat., May 7	10 a.m. - 4 p.m.

There will be no charge for the tags, but an acknowledgement of pool rules must be signed before the tags are issued. No tags will be issued to children without a parent present.

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

WELCOME MAT OUT FOR PURPLE MARTINS

The beautiful wildflowers of Texas are a welcome sign of spring to all of us. But another sign of the season, the migration of colorful birds to the area, is missed by many.

Several Oakwood Glen residents welcome the Purple Martins to the area each spring with as much joy as others reserve for the bluebonnets. Perhaps more, since these sociable birds devour huge quantities of insects including mosquitos. When the martins are here, chances of enjoying a pleasant evening outdoors is greatly increased!

The martins nest only in man-made houses, a number of which you will see towering in Oakwood Glen. Several families will live in a single house if the house had more than one story. When the young martins hatch and are ready to fly, all the adult martins from the area congregate at the home of the youngsters, circling and calling until the young join them for their first flight.

You can identify the purple martins by looking closely for the purple-blue coloring with a pronounced steel color in its glossy plumage. Black streaks are in its tail and wings. Adults are about 8 inches long with a forked tail about half the length of the wing. The females and young birds are light-bellied and might be confused with smaller swallows.

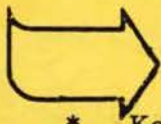
In today's environment, these feathered friends have a tough fight to reproduce. Keeping your cats (and children with b-b guns) under control during the nesting season would help. Too many of our birds are joining the ranks of the endangered animals of the world.

SECURITY TIPS FOR BEING HOME ALONE



- * Keep doors locked at all times, day and night.
- * Install a peephole in your front door so you can see who's there.
- * Don't leave notes on your door or newspapers accumulating on your porch or lawn.
- * Close drapes or blinds at night.
- * Don't automatically open the door; have caller identify himself.
- * Ask for identification from any serviceman. If you aren't expecting him, call his company to check before letting him in.
- * If a stranger asks for help, don't open the door; make a phone call for him.
- * If you're asked whether your husband is home, say, "Yes, but he's asleep," etc.
- * Keep garage doors closed whenever possible.
- * If you return home and something is not right, don't go in. Call the Constable from a neighbor's and have him go in with you to check the house.

of two picnic tables. The now-defunct Oakwood
Women's Club has donated \$125 from their
funds toward purchase of the picnic tables also.

Greg Johnson, Director of Maintenance
and Development, reported on progress in repairs
and painting of the pool house. The underground
leak there has also been repaired. Additional
posts and fencing were added to the park area
to prevent unauthorized access to the park
area by vehicles. Vehicles in the park green
areas have, in the past, created trenching and
damage to water pipes.

It was reported that legal action will be
taken for foreclosure procedures on a property
which has been in violation of deed restrictions.
Three new suits have been filed against residents
in violation of deed restrictions regarding improper
fencing and nuisance violations.

Resident Dan Miller presented a plan for
building a playscape, swings, and permanent
volleyball posts in Oakwood Glen Park using
volunteer labor. The playscape would be similar
to the one built in the front Recreation Area
last year, which turned out well. \$1600 was
approved for the purchase and delivery of mate-
rials (see related article).

The next scheduled meeting of the Board
will be on Tuesday, April 12, at 7:30 p.m. at
Oakwood Glen Park Pavilion. All residents
are welcome to attend.
