\* MAY HOMEOWNER'S BOARD MEETING \*

The Board of Directors met on May 14 and discussed many subdivision matters. It was reported that removal of recreation area basketball courts will be deferred. Rather, the water district has consented to install basketball goals on an existing slab on M.U.D. 24 property across Deer Creek from La Petite. They have also agreed to provide maintenance, lights and picnic tables at that site.

It was also announced that the Water Board and Homeowner's Board have signed a contract allowing the Water Board to hold meetings in the soon-to-be-completed meeting room at Oakwood Glen Park for ten years. The Water Board presented a check for \$6000.00 to our Board to be used for completing construction. This amount represents meeting room rental for ten years (two meetings a month).

The Water Board will continue to furnish oak trees for use on public land to Oakwood Glen. These trees will be transferred from Water district property under construction.

The Women's Club reported their official name change, and announced that signs would be purchased to be installed at the subdivision entry ways. The purpose of the signs will be to post announcements and meeting times.

It was reported that letters have been sent to owners of property fronting Oakwood Glen Blvd but not

part of the subdivision who are benefitting from street lights paid for by Oakwood Glen. Some owners have promised to pay their share. Letters will be sent to those who didn't respond, that unless they pay for the electricity, the Board will request that the lights be shut off September 30 when our current contract with H. L. & P. expires.

The Photo ID system at the pool is evidently working. It is helping to keep non-Oakwood Glen'ers from using the pool, and helping to persuade property owners to pay their maintenance fees, if they have not already done so. It was suggested at the meeting that whenever possible, ID's be checked just outside the pool gate, and a small table will be installed for that purpose. The painting of the pool restrooms has been completed.

Two Board members resigned at the May meeting. Bill Burns resigned for personal reasons, and Mary Ann Tucker is leaving due to a transfer to California. Thank you and we'll miss you!!!! Cindy Pace was elected to fill one vacancy. Welcome aboard. There are presently two vacancies on the Board. If you wish to serve in this important way, call Jean Lewis 251-1088.

In other business, it was reported that there was no response to plans for a Memorial Day tennis tournament. Plans for a golf tournament and 4th of July picnic have not yet been decided. In addition, it was stated

At the May Homeowner's Board meeting there were several questions about why the May issue was so late. I was gratified by the discussions because it revealed to me how important the "ACORN" is to many residents. Of course, it could be that you are low on place-mats, or bird cage liners, but let's not dwell on that.

That the newsletter appears on your doorstep on the 1st of each month is ideal, but many times problems intervene. There are many areas where snags might occur. This is the "Domino Theory of Newsletter Distribution":

1. The editor - a chronic procrastinator and occasionally very busy person, who does not get the material together early enough.
2. The typist - no problem here, Terry Alcott is organized and has offered to help #1.
3. The printer - who is sometimes running late, and then again may have been requested to do something special that takes longer.
4. The distributors - the "ACORN" goes this way -- General Coordinators (one for each section), the Area Coordinators (12), then to Block Captains and finally to individual homes. At step #4, distribution may become uneven. You have to figure one day at each station. The majority of distributors are very generous with getting the ACORN out. A few are not. In view of these possibilities, I have invented the following rule of thumb: I will make every attempt to get the newsletter to the General Coordinator before the 1st. If you have not received it by the 7th of every month, call your Block Captain.

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\* NEWS FROM CYPRESS CREEK LIBRARY \*

June marks the beginning of the Cypress Creek Library's summer programs for children. On June 3, the children will begin signing up for the two summer reading programs. These programs continue through Aug 10. The Texas summer reading program is designed for independent readers. Each child who reads and records 10 book titles in a booklog will receive a certificate. The children are encouraged to keep reading and enjoying books through the summer. The Read-to-Me program is designed for the pre-reader. Each child who listens to and has 10 book titles recorded in a booklog will receive a certificate. The children are encouraged to keep listening or reading books all summer. Any book read or listened to by a child qualifies for the program. The books may come from any source, be read anywhere, and anytime between June 3 and Aug 10.

On Wed, June 19, the Harris County puppeteers will present programs at 10:15 and 11:15 am. The programs will consist of three short puppet shows interspersed with several songs. These are programs to be enjoyed by pre-school and young elementary children.

"How Safe is Your Water?" is the title of a program presented by Glenda Flynn of Action Enterprises. The program will be held from 7:30 - 9:00 on Monday, June 3. Action Enterprises have done extensive testing of the water in the Klein-Spring-Cypress north area around Cypress Creek. They will be providing information on what is found in the water in this area, what are the health risks present in the water. Discussion will include information on what will or can be done by state and/or local governments to correct the unsafe condition of the water and what responsibilities will need to be assumed by the homeowner.

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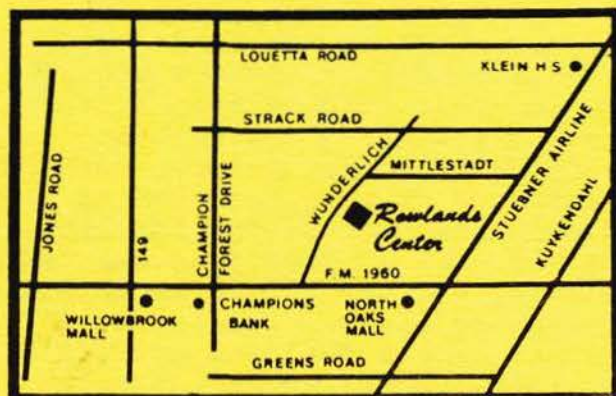
