BOARD MEETING NEWS

The June Meeting of the Oakwood Glen Board of Directors was held Tuesday, June 14. Directors Baalman, Crider, Gleason, Fillion, Johnson, McNinch, Nichols and Palmquist were present, along with Community Manager Stella Walleck, and Water Board representative Bob Walker.

The Collections Committee reported that between 100 and 150 lots are unpaid or partially paid, with several residents paying monthly. Demand letters have been issued and the Credit Bureau is in the process of making contacts.

The Deed Restrictions Chairman Barbara Fillion reported that unmaintained yards continue to be the biggest problem.. Forced mowing of properties takes place once a month. Builders who own properties will be sent letters notifying them that they are in violation of Deed Restrictions.

Security Chairman David Gleason reported that the neighborhood has been relatively quiet. Anthony Harrison has been appointed our new Overtime Officer. 32 hours of overtime were used for June and 30 hours were requested and approved for July. Mr. Gleason reported that security rates have increased 1% from last year, from \$25,909 to \$26,168.

Activities Chairman Julie Crider reported that the first Summer Fun Day attracted about 40 children and went smoothly. More are planned throughout the summer.

Greg Johnson of Maintenance and Development Committee reported that a new lifeguard stand has been built for the pool area, and a lockable cable added to secure pool furniture at night. Various lighting problems were corrected, plumbing in the pool house repaired and a small drinking fountain installed at the rear of the pool house, facing the tennis courts. A motion to award \$1200 for installation of security lighting at the recreation area was approved. Repainting of the entrance signs was also discussed.

If you are wondering how your yard can qualify for Yard of the Month, here are the guidelines used in making the selection. If you have admired a certain yard and wish it to be considered, call Pat Paustian, 251-1502

Yard of the Month Guidelines

1. Yard must be recently mowed and edged.
2. Flowerbeds must be weeded.
3. Shrubs must be uniform and balanced.
4. Yard should have color: flowers or shrubs.
5. Grass should be healthy and green with no brown patches or dead shrubs.
6. House must not need obvious repairs, such as painting.
7. House must not be for sale.
8. Yard can only be picked once in a year's time.

AREA PARKS HAVE LOTS TO OFFER

Looking for something to do with the kids or the family this summer? Try checking out some of the area parks! Depending on the weather, a can of "Off" would be a wise investment.

For starters, there is our very own Oakwood Glen Park in the rear of the subdivision, off White Tail Drive. There are picnic tables, nature trails, play equipment, a ball field and a pavilion. Squirrels, birds, rabbits and other critters still visit the area too. Remember to call the Community Manager to make reservations if you want to use the area for a group gathering. It is becoming more and more popular.

Have you discovered Cypresswood Park (the one behind the library) off Cypresswood Drive? Or Spring Creek Park just north of Tomball Off FM 149. Both offer play equipment, restrooms, picnic tables, ball fields, a basketball court, trails and more.

There is a nice park off 149, too, just north of the YMCA but on the opposite side of the highway. Picnicing and lots of nature trails are there—a nice early morning walking spot.

Mercer Arboretum continues to bloom and grow. Located off Aldine Westfield Road, it offers hours of fun with its flowers, lily ponds, trees, well-maintained trails, restrooms and picnic facilities. YOU can get there without going on FM 1960, too, if you go east on Spring-Cypress, across I45 and then turn right onto Lexington just before you get to Old Town Spring. Take Lexington to Aldine-Westfield and go south for a few minutes and you're there!

If you go a little further, there's a great park called Jesse Jones. Complete with an air-conditioned Nature Center, this extensive park has play equipment, picnicing, and miles of interesting trails and wildlife. Special programs are offered year-round. You can reach Jesse Jones Park by going east on FM 1960, almost to Humble. Watch for the Kenswick subdivision entrance on the left. It's a straight shot through that subdivision to the park.


