May Board Meeting

The monthly meeting of the Oakwood Glen Association took place May 12, 7:30 PM at the Park Pavilion. Seven Board members, Community Manager Stella Walleck, and four interested residents attended.

Maintenance & Development Committee reported that in the Rec area the work on lights is continuing. Keys issued to people who are not residents of OWG is still a problem. The Board discussed ways to check all keys and the problem is being watched closely. Soda machine arrived and will be filled soon. See related article pertaining to the burglary of the pavilion in the park area.

Kathy Baumgartner, Deed Restrictions, reported 34 new violations, two certified letters sent, two with attorney, and two force mows. Drive-thru was on April 21.

Antoinette Mattaliano, Pool Use Director, reported a new clock will be installed at the pool. Pool tags are being issued with a good response. The Committee is looking into matters concerning the cracks in the pool.

Judy Peplinski, Activities Director, reported that the pool party plans are well under way. The Board approved a \$600 budget for the event. Plans are being made for a summer time wine and cheese party in the back park.

Collections are at 84% for 1992. Letters will be sent out for any outstanding fees and will be sent to the attorneys probably in July.

Rick Corbin, Water Board, reported that construction on Windy Point is almost completed. Water District elections were held and all incumbents were re-elected including Corbin, OWG resident.

Dave Gleason, Security, reported seven misdemeanor arrests, 22 traffic warnings, and 58 traffic citations. Constable Deputy Rob Barnes purchased the radar unit himself and is using it in his patrol car. OWG did not purchase this unit.

Julie Crider, New Residents, reported she has handed out five new packets with several more still pending to go out. She will distribute additional packets at the pool party.

Architectural Control Committee reported that two reports have been turned in. After changes made to one of the reports, both were accepted.

The Board will meet next on Tuesday, June 9, 7:30 PM at the Park Pavilion. As an Oakwood Glen homeowner, you have a right to attend each and every meeting to voice concerns, ask questions, make comments, and / or complaints. Exercise your rights! Crimes cost everyone. If anyone knows anything about this burglary, or heard or saw anything, please contact Deputy Barnes at the Constable's office' 376-3472.

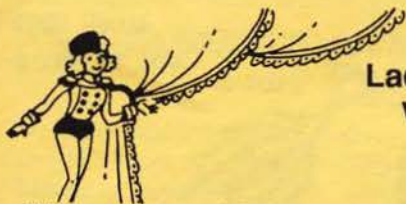


Key Alert

Residents of OWG pay for upkeep of recreation facilities through Association dues and therefore have exclusive rights to use all OWG facilities.

The Board of Directors is adopting rules governing use of the common areas in OWG. The Board will have the right to suspend any rights of any resident to use of the facilities for sixty days if a resident has misused the keys.

Misuse includes lending a key to someone who is not a resident of OWG. This is described in Article 7, Section 1A, of the Bylaws of the Oakwood Glen Association.

Home Improvements Or Modifications Require ACC Approval

Any improvements to property in Oakwood Glen must have Architectural Control Committee approval. "Improvements" are any changes which would alter the existing architectural plan of the property. Application for approval must be made prior to commencing considered improvements.

To get an Approval Request Form, contact Consolidated Management Services, 876-2502.

On the Form, in addition to the property owner's name and address, the following information is to be given in detail: description of improvements to be made (attach a sketch if necessary), who will perform the work, construction start date, location of improvements, list of materials including colors of paints or stains to be used.

Even though applicants are not to begin construction improvements until the ACC notifies approval, the Committee agrees to act upon requests as quickly as possible.
