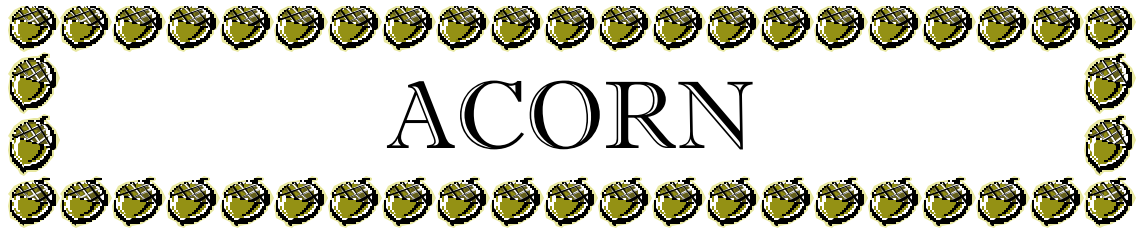

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG!!!!

The Utility Coordinating Committee (UCC) is a Damage Prevention Council. Please allow us to share some important safety information with you.

If you, or a contractor hired by you, are planning any type of digging (such as landscaping, installing sprinkler systems, swimming pools, spas, fences, decks etc.), you should first call the **Lone Star Notification Center** at (713) 223-4567 or (800) 669-8344 to identify potential buried powerlines, pipelines, or other service lines. A National Common Ground study reveals that fifty percent of underground utility damages are caused by people digging without knowing the location of buried utility lines. One careless dig can cause the following:

- ◆ **Loss of service** - Entire subdivisions, shopping malls and medical centers could lose electric power, gas service, telephone service, cable TV, 911

service and cellular phone connections. *Someone in your neighborhood may depend on life support equipment which requires electric power.*

- ◆ **Expense** - Labor, supplies and equipment to repair underground facilities can cost hundreds of dollars, in some cases thousands. Remember that insurance companies pass the cost onto consumers.
- ◆ **Threat to life and health** - If you hit a power line with mechanical equipment or hand digging tools, you can be shocked or electrocuted. If you hit a gas line, chances are you will cause a fire.

48 hours, call the **CenterPoint Energy** hot line at **713-207-5463** if you have problems locating a gas or electric line.

For safety's sake, plan your project. Call the Lone Star Notification Center 48 hours before you dig. Utility companies will come out and stake their buried lines free of charge. However, in Houston and some surrounding areas, power lines on private property may not belong to the utility (CenterPoint Energy) and will not be staked. You may contact private location companies for this service for a modest fee. Private location companies are in no way affiliated with the UCC, Lone Star Notification Center or CenterPoint Energy.

To request the location of underground utility lines, call the **Lone Star Notification Center** at **713-223-4567** or **800-669-8344**. After waiting

ADDITIONAL SECURITY FOR OWG—TO BE VOTED ON AT THE ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS IN 2006

SECURITY FOR OAKWOOD GLEN

Last year OWG paid for two deputy constables to provide extra patrols for this community. It was felt that this provided the community with the necessary coverage to provide a safe environment for all of the homeowners of this community. When the board was passing on the current budget we found that the extra money for a second constable deputy was not available based on collections for 2006 maintenance dues. Many people, not only board members, put in time to help develop this year's budget. It provided for one deputy to provide additional security patrol on what is called a 70-30 contract. This means that all of us, through our maintenance dues, pay for 70% of the deputies salary and we get 70% of their time spent in our community. The board had not raised the maintenance dues by the maximum 3% over the last 4 years, we did raise the dues this year; however, the raise was insufficient to cover the \$50,000.00 that an additional deputy would cost. We have one deputy constable that is on additional patrol in our community.

When the re-call was done security appeared to be a top priority and the board has attempted to address this important issue. Without the "income" to cover the costs it would be irresponsible to pay for this additional deputy from "reserve" funds, this would deplete these funds to an unacceptable level. The 2006 budget does allow for a replenishing of these funds to acceptable levels.

Please be aware of the following first, if you call "911" that call is initially handled by the Sheriff's office, that office establishes the priority of the call, if the call is critical they may respond; however, because we have a contract with the Constables' office the call may be passed off to them to respond to. The Constable's office has access to various additional services and to other agencies. Please understand that the passing off of calls because of a contract with the Constable's office is not a choice of the street officers. This policy is from the top, this board has tried to get information concerning this because we feel as you do, we pay county taxes, and we should get county services. The only way to push this

is for individuals to contact Commissioner Eversole's office (phone: 713-755-6444; email: JerryEversole@hcp4.net) and contact the County Judge's office (Robert Eckels —713-755-4000; judge_eckels@co.harris.tx.us) to complain about this situation.

We need to decide on the security issues for this community. All of us have a vested interest in being safe in our homes and deserve the right to quiet and peaceful enjoyment of our homes. The board has done all that it can to address this issue. The rest is up to the members (homeowners') of this community.

There is a section in the Deed Restrictions which allows for the homeowners, by a 2/3rd's vote, being those constituting a quorum, which is 1/10th of those homeowners eligible to vote, to increase the maintenance dues by whatever amount they feel is appropriate. The estimated amount needed to provide the second deputy is \$50,000.00 annually, this amount can be achieved by increasing the maintenance dues by \$60.00 per home per year; that is \$5.00 per month, per home. This is not a board issue, this is a homeowner issue. This can only be done by you, each of you. As President of the Association I can call a special members meeting to vote on this issue, however, I will not call one if there is insufficient support for this idea. This is not something that can be done quickly nor should it be, there is a lot to consider and to think about. The community has a website (oakwoodglen.net, please type this in your address bar, then mark in your favorites) I will ask the webmaster to prepare a place to voice your opinion. You may also mail your opinion to me at 17726 Mellow Ridge Dr., Spring, Texas 77379. If you wish you may call me at 281-370-7368 to voice your opinion. Please understand that I am looking for your opinion so that I can determine if there is a need to call a special meeting of the members in order to vote on this issue. This will not be "done deal" until you vote.

Thanks for taking the time to read this and please let me know your opinion on this issue.

Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Oakwood Glen, filed 12/11/75 under Harris County Clerk's File No. E524197, Article IV, Section 3, part b states

"From and after January 1 of the year immediately following the conveyance of the first lot to an Owner, the maximum Annual assessment may be increased above 3% by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of each class of members who are voting in person or by proxy, at a meeting duly called for this purpose"

Supplemental Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions Oakwood Glen, Section Two, filed 12/5/77, under Harris County Clerk's File No. F395956, Article VI, Section 3, Part c states

"From and after January 1 of the next succeeding year following the initial annual maintenance charge assessment, the maximum annual assessment may be increased for any year by an amount in excess of the three percent (3%) of the allowable maximum annual assessment for the previous year, only by a vote of at least two-thirds (2/3rds) of each class of Members who are voting in person or by proxy, at a meeting duly called for this purpose."

Believe it or not, summer is quickly approaching, and soon you'll be lounging around the pool. The management team of DS Recreational Services, Inc. is delighted to be coming to Oakwood Glen. Our goal every summer is best defined by our mission statement: SAFETY IS OUR #1 PRIORITY!!! We are also committed to treating our customers with a pleasant and courteous service, as they enjoy their clean swimming environment. We feel communication is the key. Please don't hesitate to contact our office at anytime concerning our service (281-443-7665).

To help assure a safe and fun summer for everyone, DS Recreational Services, Inc. would like to remind you of a few facility and safety reminders:

1. No running or rough play (throwing each other, pushing, dunking, getting on another's shoulders, splash fights, dog fights.)
2. No glass containers or alcoholic beverages allowed in the pool area.
3. No diving in shallow end of pool (6 feet or less)
4. No swimming in designated diving areas of pool.
5. Only small floating items, upon pool manager's discretion, will be allowed in the pool.
6. Swimmers in the water have the right of way. Those entering the water from diving boards, the deck or from water slides must make certain no one is in front of them.
7. No pets are permitted on pool premises.
8. Proper swimming attire required. Cut-offs or colored T-shirts are not allowed.
9. The use of cocoa butter, baby oil, and other heavy suntan oils causes filter damage. It is advised that these lotions not be permitted in the pool.
10. Members who have quests must sign them in and be responsible for them at all times. If the member leaves so does the quest.
11. Stay off the ropes.
12. All children under 10 years of age must be accompanied by an adult at least 18 years of age and stay within an arms reach. Any child between the ages of ten (10) and twelve (12) years of age may enter the pool area unaccompanied by an adult if said child has passed the swim test. (Swim test: Swim the entire length of the pool without stopping & tread water in the deep end for 2 minutes using arms and legs.)
13. No swimming after designated swimming hours, unless special arrangements have been made through the Contractor or the Board of Directors. Anyone caught swimming after hours will be suspended for the remainder of the summer and have trespassing charges filed against him or her.
14. No one will be admitted without the proper I.D. (when applicable)
15. Obey lifeguards and other supervisory personnel. Talking with lifeguards on duty is prohibited.
16. Chewing gum while swimming is prohibited.
17. Swimming with an open sore or a communicable disease is prohibited.
18. Jumping off backwards or anyway that throws the head back towards the side of the pool is prohibited. Flips from the side of the pool are not allowed.

19. Be alert to anyone in trouble. Call for help immediately. Do not move or remove injured people from the water who complain of back or neck injuries.
20. Lifeguards are employed to ensure the safety of the swimmers. They have authority to remove from the pool anyone disobeying the rules or endangering the safety of himself or another person. The lifeguard has the authority to suspend offender for one day. Additional violations will be turned over to the pool committee. Repeat violations may result in revocation of swimming privileges for the remainder of the summer.

1 & 1/4 LB. LEAN BEEF CHUCK FOR STEW -CUT IN 3/4 " PIECES

1 LB. CARROTS-SLICED

2 MEDIUM ONIONS-THINLY SLICED

3 CUPS THINLY SLICED CABBAGE

2 CUPS WATER OR 1/2 CUP RED WINE PLUS 1&1/2 CUPS
WATER

1 (6OZ.) CAN TOMATO PASTE

1 ENVELOPE ONION-MUSHROOM SOUP MIX (FROM A 1.8-
OZ BOX)

1 TBSP. PAPRIKA

1 CUP (8 OZ.) REDUCED-FAT SOUR CREAM

MAY GARDENING

Time to pull cool weather annuals like snap dragons and pansies and prepare your garden beds for summer annuals.

Bed Preparation-Raised Beds are best for annuals. **Remove** all weeds and cool weather plantings. **Turn** soil to a depth of at least 8 inches. **Spread** a 4-inch layer of compost, aged manure or peat moss over the bed. **Blend** the organic material thoroughly into the soil. **Rake** smooth and plant. After planting, **apply** a layer of mulch around and between transplants. Leave no soil bare. **Plant** in staggered rows-this will be more visually appealing than simple straight lines. If transplant is root bound, loosen gently before planting. Don't plant too deep or close together. **Water** in with root stimulant or add one-teaspoon slow release fertilizer to the hole of each transplant. Good results can be achieved with water soluble fertilizers applied at planting and with moderation throughout the summer. -From Month-By-Month Gardening in Texas by Dale Groom & Dan Gill
