FRONT PARK

Your board voted to install an electronic card key system at the front park. We felt that there were too many keys outstanding to people who didn't need to have them. Your Association will be providing one unique card key to each homeowner. If additional card keys are desired they can be purchased for \$25.00 per key, if they are lost or stolen the replacement cost will be \$25.00. This amount may seem high but we are hoping to dedicate the money to purchasing security camera's to be installed at the front park gate and at the pool and possibly at the basketball courts to provide a record of who is there and if there is any vandalism going on. The front gate will have an alarm on it so that if the gate is propped open the alarm will sound and the system operator, the management company, will be notified so that the Constable can be called to go by to see what's going on. The keys given out will be numbered and matched to each person requesting them. The system will provide a record of who is opening the gate and when and how many times. We can also locked down the park after midnight to all keys. If you want specific hours of availability for your kids that can be programmed in the keys. This system will allow us to hopefully provide a safe environment for our residents and their kids. We will not activate the system until all homes have received their keys. The pool gate will also be on this system and will help us to get a usage count at the pool. We are hoping to eventually expand the system to include a security camera and access, to the keys provided to adults only, to the bathroom. This seems to be needed so when families are up at the park there are facilities available onsite. Editor

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Architectural Control Committee Information

I would like to take this space to provide some basic information about the Architectural Control Committee function and its general purpose.

First, this is a residential subdivision and the Deed Restrictions and the ACC guidelines are designed to keep the neighborhood look consistent with the look that this community started with. Improvements to homes should be

looked at as extension of the existing architecture of the home. The Deed Restrictions provide limits to what can be placed in the front yard, especially in front of the building set back line.

Second, any improvements to the front yard or to the front of the house will be looked at very carefully to make sure that they do not violate the restrictions and that the improvements are in keeping with the architecture of the home.

Third, there is always the availability to present your request to the full board for review if you believe that the ACC committee was wrong in their decision.

Please know that these decisions are not easy to make but the idea is to maintain the look of this community and to maintain the value of all of our homes.

As you drive around the neighborhood you will see a lot of different homes, some

have added improvements to their back yards for entertaining. Few, if any, have added an entertaining area in the front yard.

Your help and cooperation is appreciated. Please remember that the ACC committee is made up of your neighbors and we try very hard to be fair and equitable in making these decisions.

ADDITIONAL SECURITY FOR OWG—TO BE VOTED ON AT THE ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS IN 2006

SECURITY FOR OAKWOOD GLEN

I have received numerous opinions concerning the additional money as well as the idea of having an additional deputy under contract for our community.

The opinions range from No to Hell No to why should we pay for more security when the security we have doesn't do their job. Some people actually feel that the extra \$5.00 per month would be money well spent, regardless of whether we have the Constable or the Sheriff's office as additional security. The issue is divisive, one of our residents seems to feel that the board "busted" the budget last year to hire two deputies, I disagree with that assessment. I believe that this community is large enough to need two deputies for patrol. I also know that the character of our community is changing as all things do. If we want to keep up with other communities in our area we need to be ahead of the problem not playing catch-up.

High visibility of law enforcement in our community is necessary. The changes that are occurring are changes that are not always covered under our Deed Restrictions and the extra patrol would help to dissuade certain elements from setting up shop in our community.

Whichever law enforcement agency we go with, Constable or Sheriff, the visibility of two deputies would be a welcomed addition to this community.

One anecdotal note from me, last year when we had two deputies, I noticed more children riding their bikes, more ladies walking around dusk through the neighborhood. While I can't substantiate the changes with numbers or statistics I felt a difference last year, especially in the summer months, when the kids are out of school. Is this about feeling safe, yes. The idea that I will feel safe only if there is a deputy on every corner is not true but I did feel safer last year knowing that we had additional coverage out here. Is this an emotional issue, yes, for me it is. I want my wife to be safe coming home late and driving through our neighborhood without fear. I want to know that my home is safe from vandals and burglars. I believe in Oakwood Glen and I believe that as neighbors we can disagree and still be neighbors. Please let us all work to make our neighborhood safe, secure and attractive to potential buyers. My home is a major investment and I definitely want the

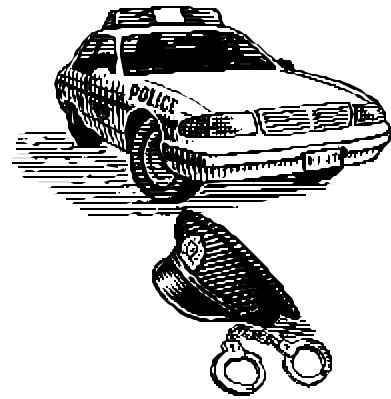
value to increase. I believe safety and security add to the integrity of my community and increases the value of all of our homes.

I was provided a copy of a book by our Deputy Hill, entitled "Elements of a Crime", A Law Officers Guide, published by the Council for Law Education and Research, P.O. Box 16-1237, Austin, Texas 78716. This book turned out to be very enlightening in allowing me to see what an officer needs to include in their report whenever they have a call to a problem. There are 17 questions under WHO? There are 9 questions under WHEN? There are 13 questions under WHAT? There are 16 questions under WHERE? There are 10 questions under WHY? There are 12 questions under HOW? There are 4 questions under WITH WHAT? There are 6 questions under WITH WHOM? There are 8 questions under HOW MUCH?

From all of this I am beginning to have a better understanding of what goes in to a report on an event or call that requires a report. Every time that the Deputy has to fill out a report time is necessary to allow that Deputy to complete that report properly. Unless the report is filled out correctly there may be gaps in the record of what is occurring in our community.

Our Deputy spends the majority of her time patrolling however there are times when completing a report is necessary in order to move forward with the incident. Some people have make comments about seeing our Deputy at the EMS building, let me say that the EMS building owners let our deputy use their restroom when needed. So please, lets give the benefit of the doubt to the deputy. Believe me when I tell you that she is making every effort to be visible all over the community. If you see areas that need additional patrols please let me know and I will forward the report to the Security Director who will connect with the Constables' office to adjust the patrols to meet the needs of this community. Our contract with the Constable's office is important to the Constable and they want to be responsive to our needs, so please let's keep them apprised of needs and let's look for the good that they do. It is a thankless job and perhaps we need to give more appreciation for the service that they provide and less critical.

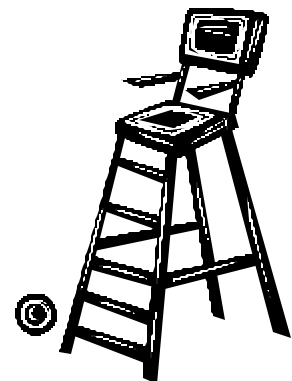

Believe it or not, summer is quickly approaching, and soon you'll be lounging around the pool. The management team of DS Recreational Services, Inc. is delighted to be coming to Oakwood Glen. Our goal every summer is best defined by our mission statement: SAFETY IS OUR #1 PRIORITY!!! We are also committed to treating our customers with a pleasant and courteous service, as they enjoy their clean swimming environment. We feel communication is the key. Please don't hesitate to contact our office at anytime concerning our service (281-443-7665).

To help assure a safe and fun summer for everyone, DS Recreational Services, Inc. would like to remind you of a few facility and safety reminders:

1. No running or rough play (throwing each other, pushing, dunking, getting on another's shoulders, splash fights, dog fights.)
2. No glass containers or alcoholic beverages allowed in the pool area.
3. No diving in shallow end of pool (6 feet or less)
4. No swimming in designated diving areas of pool.
5. Only small floating items, upon pool manager's discretion, will be allowed in the pool.
6. Swimmers in the water have the right of way. Those entering the water from diving boards, the deck or from water slides must make certain no one is in front of them.
7. No pets are permitted on pool premises.
8. Proper swimming attire required. Cut-offs or colored T-shirts are not allowed.
9. The use of cocoa butter, baby oil, and other heavy suntan oils causes filter damage. It is advised that these lotions not be permitted in the pool.
10. Members who have quests must sign them in and be responsible for them at all times. If the member leaves so does the quest.
11. Stay off the ropes.
12. All children under 10 years of age must be accompanied by an adult at least 18 years of age and stay within an arms reach. Any child between the ages of ten (10) and twelve (12) years of age may enter the pool area unaccompanied by an adult if said child has passed the swim test. (Swim test: Swim the entire length of the pool without stopping & tread water in the deep end for 2 minutes using arms and legs.)
13. No swimming after designated swimming hours, unless special arrangements have been made through the Contractor or the Board of Directors. Anyone caught swimming after hours will be suspended for the remainder of the summer and have trespassing charges filed against him or her.
14. No one will be admitted without the proper I.D. (when applicable)
15. Obey lifeguards and other supervisory personnel. Talking with lifeguards on duty is prohibited.
16. Chewing gum while swimming is prohibited.
17. Swimming with an open sore or a communicable disease is prohibited.
18. Jumping off backwards or anyway that throws the head back towards the side of the pool is prohibited. Flips from the side of the pool are not allowed.

19. Be alert to anyone in trouble. Call for help immediately. Do not move or remove injured people from the water who complain of back or neck injuries.
20. Lifeguards are employed to ensure the safety of the swimmers. They have authority to remove from the pool anyone disobeying the rules or endangering the safety of himself or another person. The lifeguard has the authority to suspend offender for one day. Additional violations will be turned over to the pool committee. Repeat violations may result in revocation of swimming privileges for the remainder of the summer.

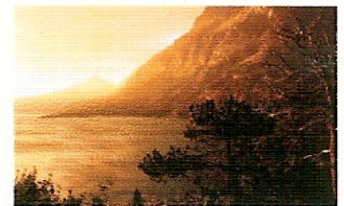

Restrictions filed under Harris County Clerk's File No. E624197; Article VII, Section 15.; states "No trucks, trailers, boats, or any vehicle other than passenger cars will be permitted to park on streets on drives in front of residence for longer than a forty-eight (48) hour period."

Restrictions filed under Harris County Clerk's File No. F395956; Article VIII, Section 7, part (d) states "No truck, bus, motor home, boat or trailer shall be left parked in or on the street adjacent to any lot, or in the driveway or on any other portion or any such Lot exposed to public view (except for construction or repair equipment, only while a house or houses are being built or repaired in the immediate vicinity), unless such vehicle is in day-to-day use off the premises and such parking is only temporary, from day-to-day; provided however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit the storage of an unused vehicle in an enclosed garage on an Lot."

FOR INFORMATION ON THE PETITION TO BAN COMMERCIAL VEHICLES FROM OVERNIGHT PARKING, FROM 10 PM UNTIL 6AM, PURSUANT TO TEX. TRANSP.CODE ANN. 522.003 (VERNON 1997), SAME CONTAINS A DEFINITION OF A COMMERCIAL VEHICLE.
